2. Steering Committee member endorsement of SWA – Chris

• Several partners outlined approaches to date in preparations for member endorsement approaches, including ECCC/MECP indicating similar approaches to the sign-off for the Grand River Water Management Plan, OMAFRA,CAs, boards and FNs councils for next steps.

3. Update on Antler River Guardians program for 2020 season – Cheriene

- Cheriene, Emma, Chris and Tara updated the proposal early in the new year and the finances have come through for summer 2020
- There is a recognition that with COVID the summer might look a little different, but hopefully the program will run at some capacity during the 2020 summer
- As the program develops, it may need assistance from other agencies as in the past (MNRF rangers, technical expertise and support, connections)

4. Work Planning/Next Steps

- a. Proposals for work this year
 - i. SWA Implementation and Outreach Chris
 - Originally envisioned as a COA planned proposal

- Implementation aligns with the LTVCA goals
- Suggest that it will be important to recognize agricultural groups during outreach, engagement and potential participation in future activities

- Each committee representative will let Chris / Pat know if they can support the proposal in principle by April 9th, 2020
 - iii. Others All
 - LTVCA mentioned the recurring algal blooms that seem to be separate cause than those from Lake St. Clair, perhaps coming from upstream given the speciation of the algae, and that it might be good project to determine where the blooms in the lower Thames are coming from
 - Presentation by MECP on joint project at a HABs workshop this week highlighted some different speciation of the HABs in/from the Thames River compared to other areas.
 - FNs engagement plan associated with City of London's WWTP Master Plan

ACTIONS:

- Cheriene will look into hosting a webinar with Ngan Diep about this
 - LTVCA mentioned that another topic might be Species At Risk. UTRCA mentioned that an ecosystem based recovery strategy for the Thames might have some appeal, which may include a natural heritage system strategy
 - b. Steering Committee role moving forward All
 - We are in a period of transition, would be helpful to keep the representation but perhaps we need to open it up to others, as well as other members on the committee
 - The role is tied into where the implementation is going to go, may change the steering committee role quite a bit, so another model with more working groups might be a better approach
